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Early Head Start Child Care Partnership


- * **NEW** Federal funding opportunity
- \$500 million will be available through competitive funding opportunities in all states, territories, tribes and migrant and seasonal communities for new Early Head Start/Child Care Partnerships.
- * These will be new 5 year grants, with a new grant number.
- * FOA Funding Opportunity Announcement is expected in spring 2014, which will be paneled over the summer, and awards must be made by March 31, 2015.


- * These new federal grants will fund full-day, fullyear, birth to three year old Early Head Start services in child care centers and family child care homes.
- The intent is to raise *quality* of infant-toddler care across the nation to positively impact child outcomes.

Snapshot of Early Head Start in NY

Most EHS programs are serving the children in a **homebased** or **combination model**.

13 agencies are currently serving EHS children in a 5 day a week, full-day, full-year model.


2 agencies are offering Family Child Care EHS.
