Market Rate Survey



Introduction to the Market Rate Survey

- Every few years, the Office of Children and Family Services conducts a survey of the price of child care across the state.
- The data is used to update the market-related payment rates for the NYS Child Care Assistance Program (CCAP) for low-income families (commonly referred to as "the market rates").
- Updating the CCAP market rates is important to ensure equal access to care for families in receipt of child care assistance.
- The market rates were last updated effective June 1, 2022.




Market Rate Survey 2023

- The Market Rate Survey (MRS) includes:
 - licensed and registered child care providers across NYS, and
 - permitted group child care programs in NYC.
- The 2023 MRS includes questions about
 - Prices that providers charge parents for care,
 - Number of children enrolled,
 - Providers' experiences with CCAP, and
 - Costs for providers to operate their programs.



Online survey sent to all providers

 This September, the Market Rate Survey Team will be sending all providers an electronic survey invitation by email that contains a link to the 2023 Child Care Market Rate Survey.





Survey Success Tips

- Providers should check their email account on file with OCFS and NYC DOHMH.
- The survey can be taken from any computer web browser or mobile device.
- The survey will take providers about 15 minutes to complete.
- Providers can step away from the survey and come back to it later, as long as it has not been submitted.
- Once the survey has been submitted, it is closed and no longer available.
- The survey should be completed within two weeks of receipt of the invitation.
- Reminder follow up emails will be sent out.

Military Child Care in Your Neighborhood (MCCYN-PLUS)



MCCYN-PLUS

- Part of a national program administered by Department of Defense <u>www.militarychildcare.com</u>
- The Military Child Care in Your Neighborhood, or MCCYN, program provides fee assistance to reduce the out-of-pocket expense of community child care for eligible military families when onbase options are unavailable.

MCCYN-PLUS

- Not currently available to families and providers in NYS unless entered program through another means
- Programs approved for MCCYN-PLUS fee assistance benefit by expanding their child care businesses to a military family customer base and offer more available options for quality child care.
- National standards for provider inclusion require participation in state's QRIS

MCCYN-PLUS

- NYS is working with DoD about expanding program requirements to allow OCFS licensed/registered programs to be eligible to participate, without regard to whether they participate in QRIS
- NYS will be the first state in the nation that licensed/registered programs are allowed to participate on the basis of their compliance with licensing requirements
- NYS is being recognized for its high health and safety standards, statewide monitoring and support, and investment in CC&R network also supporting providers


