- November 2016 codified into New York State law
- Ongoing support from the Governor's Office




- QUALITYstarsNY 600+ early childhood sites are now participating!
 The most recent allocation in the '17-'18 budget will allow for very limited expansion.
- New York Works for Children Aspire has more than 27,000 participants and is growing every day.
